
Contextual Studies - Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. Where do I see my courses?

On your A5 portal under "Grades" in the "Contextual Studies" section.




2. In which time slots are there offers in the Contextual Studies?

The following time slots are kept free for the 11 master's degree programmes in the 2nd and 3rd semesters: Weekly Thursday evening (18:20 to 21:35) and two intensive training weeks (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday: 8:50 to 16:30 and Thursday: 8:50 to 14:45) per semester. Slight time variations are possible.

3. Where can I see which time slots I am booked for?

In your timetable.

Open the filter on the right (cursor) and make sure that the desired semester is displayed on the left (arrow).

4. My living conditions (work, family, health, ...) have changed and a course I have already chosen no longer fits. How do I still get the required ECTS?

The sooner you contact kontextstudium@fhv.at, the more alternatives we can offer you.

If you inform us in good time, the lecturers can also adapt their course concept and possible costs to the changed number of participants, and we may be able to give your place to someone on the waiting list.

5. I have been accepted for a Short Advanced Programme (SAP). What do I do with my booking in the Contextual Studies?

Inform us immediately at kontextstudium@fhv.at. You can then select the module that corresponds to this SAP in terms of ECTS and we will remove it from your selection. NOTE: A module can only be deselected if it has not yet started.

6. I have decided to do a semester abroad. What do I do with my booking in Contextual Studies?

Contact <u>kontextstudium@fhv.at</u> in good time. We will delete you from the courses booked with us in the semester in question. You will receive 6 ECTS credits for a semester abroad, which will be credited to your Contextual Studies.

7. I work for the ÖH. Can I have courses from the Contextual Studies credited for this assignment?
